The 2023 invoices will be going out later this month and parents will notice that even though general costs have gone up exponentially since Covid-19, Riverside College have kept fee increases to below 10%.

Operating costs have increased by 22% year on year when compared to 2021 and 2020 budgets and although it does not make financial sense to keep the fee increase to below 10% we are mindful of the fact that everyone is suffering and feeling the pinch of the increased interest rates and other costs.

Our strategy to combat any financial shortfall is to increase our learner base for 2023 and in so doing ensure that the future of Riverside College is a financially sound one.

Message from the Principal Carlien Ellis

Something that came to my attention this last week is the overwhelming feeling some learners experience when thinking about their parents' finances. I firmly believe in teaching your children about money and being financially responsible because, as the adage goes, "Money does not grow on trees."
