Top 5 facts about Youth Day in South Africa

- 1. ANC supporters at first called it Soweto Day, but the government changed it to Youth Day during Nelson Mandela's regime.
- 2. Nelson Mandela declared Youth Day an official public holiday in 1994.
- 3. Hector Pieterson, the schoolboy that the police killed in the Soweto Uprising protests that day symbolises the consequences of oppression around the world. The Hector Pieterson Memorial Museum is in Orlando West, Soweto.
- 4. Mzansi's states used to celebrate Youth Day on different days. The government made the 16th of June the official Youth Day date, and the UN made the 12th of August the International Youth Day.
- 5. June 2022 is the Soweto Uprisings' 46th anniversary since the incident happened. The National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) annually acknowledges the day through its Youth Action for Economic Freedom in Our Lifetime programme.

We need to appreciate Youth Day in South Africa by embracing the sacrifice of those who died for this country. To build a non-racial society and support young adults because South Africa needs these changes to grow.

At Riverside College, we are going to celebrate this Youth Day by writing a message to our older self, which we will then put into a time capsule box and bury on the school grounds until a future date when it will be dug up and the contents thereof revealed.
